A first-time starter under center in 2023, Granberry stepped up to the challenge. After throwing for three touchdowns in the season opener against Marshall, Granberry became the clear starter at Quarterback and ran with it. He finished third in the 5A-7 in passing yards (1,772), second in passing touchdowns (19) while leading the district in completion percentage (61%). For his efforts, he was named District Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

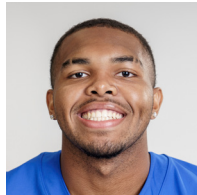

The other portion of the Sueing tandem at Linebacker for the Lions, D'Crystian has made quite the name for himself, recording 65 total tackles last year, and 81 in 2022. He rushed the passer much more last season than 2022, and it paid dividends, as he tied for second on the team with nine tackles for loss, while also recording three sacks, five hurries, recovering two fumbles, and intercepting a pass. He looks to continue his play making ways in his Senior campaign.

ROSE CITY RIVALRY

Since 1958, Tyler High School and Tyler Legacy High School have engaged in the Rose City Rivalry, a matchup between the City of Tyler's two public high schools.

Tyler High (John Tyler) against Tyler Legacy (Robert E. Lee) always draws the biggest crowd of the regular season for both teams, and has a rich history with some of the best players to ever come out of East Texas. Earl Campbell, Matt Flynn, Brandon Pettigrew Aaron Ross, and Greg Ward are just a few of the names that have played in one of the fiercest rivalries in the state of Texas.

Both teams have had their runs in the rivalry, with both sides having multiple 5+ year win streaks. With the all-time series being deadlocked last year 33-33-1. John Tyler dominated the early seasons of the rivalry, while Robert E. Lee began to gain a foothold in the early part of the 21st century.

Tyler High pulled out a 28-14 victory in 2023 to take the slight edge in the series heading into this season. In that contest, with the Lions trailing early, they came from behind - running off 28 unanswered points for their first victory over Tyler Legacy since the 2018 season, as the Seniors picked up their first ever win against the school just a few miles to the southeast.

The 2024 rendition of the Rose City Rivalry will give the Lions a chance for back-to-back wins over their crosstown rivals since the 2012 and 2013 seasons. During the two-year stretch, John Tyler went 20-6, which included an appearance in the State Semifinals. With much returning this season, the new-age Tyler High program under Rashaun Woods looks to make a run of their own.

BUILDING OFF SUCCESS FOR WOODS

On January 24th, 2023, former Oklahoma State Cowboy great and a first-round pick of the San Francisco 49ers, Rashaun Woods was hired to be the next Head Football Coach at Tyler High School. A proven program-builder at multiple stops in the state of Oklahoma, Woods was tasked with turning around a program that has had three state championships and 39 district titles, albeit, scuffling in the seasons leading up to his arrival.

Woods first season in 2023 was a major success, as he hit the ground running and tripled the program's win total from 2022, going 6-4, and just missing out on a playoff berth. His team came out hot, winning their first four games, which included Woods' first Rose City Rivalry victory over Tyler Legacy, 28-14. After his first season on the sidelines for Tyler High School, his career record sits at 73-53-1.

Prior to Tyler High School, Woods was the Head Football Coach at Enid High School in Oklahoma from 2019-2022. He was tasked with rebuilding a program that had not had a winning record since 2010 or made a playoff appearance since 2009. Following a winless first season, Woods built the program up, winning three games in both 2020 and 2021. His final season in 2022 was a breakthrough, going 5-5 in the regular season to qualify for the playoffs and winning a playoff game for the first time in over a decade.

Before that, he was the Head Football Coach at John Marshall High School in Oklahoma City. The year prior to his arrival, JMHS did not win a single game. He quickly turned around the program, finishing 7-3 with a playoff appearance by his second season. Back-to-back double digit win seasons in 2015 and 2016 signified the program's rapid turnaround, before the ascent to the mountaintop that was the 2017 season for John Marshall, as they finished 14-1 and won the Oklahoma 3A State Championship over Beggs.

His first coaching opportunity was at Star Spencer High School in Spencer, Oklahoma where he spent five seasons as an Assistant Coach, and later was the Offensive Coordinator. In 2009 he helped coach the Bobcats to a Oklahoma 4A State Championship.

Woods playing career started at Millwood High School in Oklahoma City, where he would earn a football scholarship to Oklahoma State. He set many records while playing for the Cowboys, including the NCAA record for TD receptions in a game (seven) and TD Receptions in a half (five) as well as Oklahoma State records in Career Receptions (293) and Receiving Touchdowns (42). Woods would be drafted in the 1st Round with the 31st pick in the 2004 NFL Draft, and would play in 14 games for the team in 2004. He would later play in the Canadian Football League (CFL) for the Toronto Argonauts and then in NFL Europe for the Frankfurt Galaxy.

Woods also dabbled into broadcasting, working as a High School Football Commentator while in Oklahoma as well as Professional Bass Fishing.

Woods now resides in Tyler with his wife Jenni, and his three daughters - Taylor, Avery, and Chloe.

Down 20 points, the Lions were able to dig themselves out of a big hole for the second consecutive week. However, a late try at an onside kick would fail and THS would fall to 4-2.

Forney dashed Tyler High's playoff chances, as the Jackrabbits (who would go on to be a State Semifinalist) defeated the Lions 53-29.

- The teams were tied at six after one quarter, with both teams scoring touchdowns, and getting PAT's blocked. There were four combined blocked PAT's in the game.
- However, the Jackrabbits, who gained over 600 total yards, kicked to life with 27 second-quarter points, highlighted by Javian Osborne's massive night (31 rushes, 291 yards, five touchdowns) while Tyler High got just eight points in the second quarter.

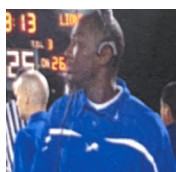
