The only offensive member of the 6A-10 First Team All-District squad, Rainer returns to start at Tight End as a senior and should provide a security blanket. He garnered seven catches for 113 yards and one touchdown last season, which was a 61-yard rumble against Mesquite last season. Known for his excellent blocking, Rainer will further boost a Tyler Legacy run game.



4 Za'Bryan Hood

Hood nabbed the second-most passes for the Black and Red last season, and now returns for his Senior season as the most productive returning pass-catcher. He made 20 catches for 268 yards and two touchdowns last season in just eight total games. This included a productive run during his final two games (five catches, 85 yards), (four catches, 52 yards vs. Wylie East).



7 Micah Pierson

Pierson returns for his Senior season, and a chance to lead the Tyler Legacy backfield in 2024 after sitting and learning behind Kalan Greenhouse last season. He should bring an element of elusive speed into the Tyler Legacy backfield to help out whoever takes the snaps. He ran for 130 yards on the ground last season, while also adding three receptions through the air.

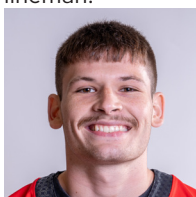

He also had three 20-tackle games, including making 24 stops against Rockwall-Heath.

Brown made 73 solo tackles to go with 8.0 TFL, while also blocking two kicks, forcing two fumbles, recovering two fumbles, and breaking up two passes en route to a Third Team All-District selection. He also made at least 10 tackles in every game after his first three, with a high of 21 against Roysse City.

ROSE CITY RIVALRY

Since 1958, Tyler High School and Tyler Legacy High School have engaged in the Rose City Rivalry, a matchup between the City of Tyler's two public high schools.

Tyler High (John Tyler) against Tyler Legacy (Robert E. Lee) always draws the biggest crowd of the regular season for both teams, and has a rich history with some of the best players to ever come out of East Texas. Earl Campbell, Matt Flynn, Brandon Pettigrew Aaron Ross, and Greg Ward are just a few of the names that have played in one of the fiercest rivalries in the state of Texas.

Both teams have had their runs in the rivalry, with both sides having multiple five-plus year win streaks. With the all-time series being deadlocked last year 33-33-1. John Tyler dominated the early seasons of the rivalry, while Robert E. Lee began to gain a foothold in the early part of the 21st century.

Tyler High pulled out a 28-14 victory in 2023 to take the slight edge in the series heading into this season. In that contest, with the Red Raiders jumping out to a quick 14-0 lead on a pair of touchdowns, the Lions hit back, scoring 28 unanswered points to shock Tyler Legacy in the 28-14 Red Raider loss.

Tyler Legacy looks to re-tie the series against Tyler High this season, as the Red Raiders look to avoid back-to-back losses against the Lions for the first time in over a decade. The Red Raiders will look to find their footing on the gas pedal in the 2024 rendition of the Rose City rivalry.

TASTE OF THE PLAYOFFS IN YEAR ONE

Hired to turn around the Tyler Legacy Football Program in 2023, Red Raider Head Coach Beau Trahan enters his second season with the program. He amassed a 3-8 record year one, which did include a playoff berth by going 3-3 in district play, and a season-ending loss in the Bi-District round to Plano East.

Trahan comes to the Rose City after spending seven seasons at the University of Tulsa (FBS), While at Tulsa, Trahan spent the first five seasons as the Quarterbacks Coach, and added Co-Passing Game Coordinator to his responsibilities in his final two seasons with the Golden Hurricane.

Known for producing highly effective passers, Trahan tutored the likes of Dane Evans (UT career passing yards leader) and Zach Smith (8th in UT career passing yards).

Prior to that, he spent eight seasons at Baylor University. His first three spent as their Director of High School Relations, another three as the Director of Football Operations, and the final two as Assistant Athletic Director in charge of High School Relations and the Football Coordinator of Recruiting.

The son of a Texas High School Football Coach, Trahan coached with his father at Dickinson High School (TX) from 2005-08 as a Co-Offensive Coordinator. His father, Warren "Bull" Trahan amassed a record of 200-136-4 from 1981-2012 with coaching stops at Cy-Fair High School and Bay City High School prior to Dickinson.

His first two coaching stops were in the Graduate Assistant Role. In 2004, he was an Offensive Assistant for the University of Houston, where he coached Special Teams and Tight Ends. His first stop was at the University of Texas in 2003, coaching Defensive Backs and Special Teams.

Trahan played four seasons at the University of Texas from 1999-2002. He played on both sides of the ball for the Longhorns, initially as a Quarterback, and then as a defensive back. He recorded 62 tackles, created two forced fumbles, and blocked a kick on defense, and had 45 yards on seven carries and two touchdowns on offense. He also served as a team captain in 2002.

Trahan graduated from the University of Texas with a degree in Kinesiology. He and his wife, Lauren, have two daughters: Abigail and Anne.

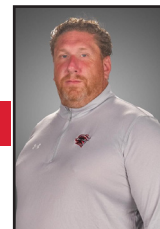

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

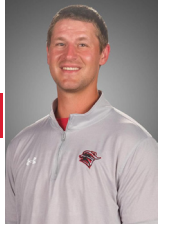
8TH SEASON - WATERLOO, IA

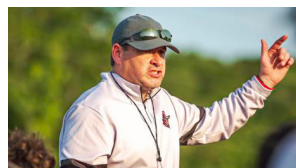
